



<u>NAPLAN</u>

NAPLAN stands for the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy. NAPLAN is a series of common literacy and numeracy tests conducted annually across Australia for all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9.

The test window is from the 13th to 25th of March. It is a requirement that all schools administer online tests, with the exception that Year 3 students will continue to complete the writing test on paper.

A parent/carer information sheet will be sent home with all students eligible to sit NAPLAN this year.
